EAST MOUNTAIN HOUSE

East Mountain House (EMH) is a community-supported organization dedicated to end-of-life care and education. Located in Lakeville, Connecticut, EMH opened in mid-September 2025 and offers a home-like environment for those who are dying, where care is personal, compassionate, and accessible.

At EMH, individuals and their families receive attentive support in a light-filled, comfortable home. We seek to restore dignity and connection to the dying process, ensuring that every person is surrounded by compassion and sensitivity to their needs and preferences.

EMH provides graciously appointed private rooms for up to two residents at a time, along with welcoming spaces for families to remain close to their loved ones throughout the dying process. Care is provided by 24-hour paid skilled staff and trained volunteers who believe deeply in our mission—offering comfort, support, and dignity at the end of life.

Who Qualifies for Care at EMH?

Prior to admission, all guests must be enrolled with VNHLC Hospice, which serves our geographic region and oversees medical care at EMH. Residents of Connecticut, Massachusetts, New York, or Rhode Island who are on hospice—or who are hospice-eligible—may enroll with VNHLC Hospice.

EMH is generally able to welcome hospice patients who are within two to three months of anticipated death. Anyone may inquire about EMH for themselves or for a loved one.

Admission is offered on a Pay-As-You-Can basis. Those who are able to contribute toward caregiver costs are invited to do so, while individuals with limited financial resources may receive care at no cost.

Outreach and Education

EMH staff and volunteers are available to meet with individuals, families, and organizations to discuss our services and broader end-of-life concerns. We offer community-based educational programs addressing issues related to death and dying.
